Food Service Changes:

- * Mrs. Elli Lamprecht has been selected to serve as our new Food Service Director for the district Mrs. Lamprecht has worked in the elementary kitchen in the past, and she will continue to be stationed at the elementary school building during the school year.
- * Mrs. Carolyn Smith has been selected to be the Food Service Supervisor at the high school building. She has worked in the high school kitchen in the past and has experience in our district.

All of these individuals are additional examples of the high quality staff we have working here in the district.

Construction Update Information:

- * Construction has been in full swing since school got out in May, and both campuses have had some dramatic changes occur so far this summer.
- * At the high school, excavation has continued on the east side of the school for the additional classrooms, CTE area, and expanded commons and office space that will be coming in that area.
- * At the elementary school, the east parking lot is being prepared for additional paving, excavation has continued on the west side of the building, and the playground has been under renovation as some of the equipment is being relocated to other areas of the playground.
- * In the coming weeks, priority work will include installing the precast concrete for the foundations at both buildings, paving the east parking lot at Bennet, preparing the elementary playground for the opening of school, installing fence around the east end of the playground at the elementary, and ensuring that all student entrances and pathways remain safe and efficient for staff, students, and our families at both sites.
- * Pictures of construction progress at both sites is also posted on our school website.

Palmyra High School:

<u>List below is a quick reminder of the changes happening at</u> the high school:

- Adding additional classrooms on the northeast side of the building.
- * Expanding the current "commons area" space near the main office, adding extra restrooms, and expanding the main office area.
- * Expanding the current Career Technical Education (CTE) areas to the southeast side of the building.
- Relocating the current music area into the current shop area.
- * Relocating the current weight room /fitness center and adding increased community access to this area.
- * Repurposing the current weight deck area in the auxiliary gym.

Other high school related information to know for the beginning of the school year:

Main Entrance:

 Just a reminder that the east entrance to the building will be closed for the entirety of the 2023-2024 school year. This means that the main entrance will now be on the west side of the building near the old football field. * There will be limited parking spots available on the west side for parents needing to stop in during the school day.

Traffic Flow and Parking:

- * In terms of traffic flow, bus transportation, and parking at the high school, Mr. Johnson has created a video that contains information about how we plan to handle student and staff parking, pedestrian, bus, and other vehicle traffic in the area.

- * Please also note that the parking lots located on the east side of the high school will not be in use all school year.
- * Please also visit our school website for more information.

Bennet Elementary:

<u>Listed below is a quick reminder of the changes happening at</u> the elementary building:

- * Adding additional classrooms on the southwest side of the building.
- * Expanding the current kitchen and student commons area to the east side of the building.
- * Expanding the current office area to the east side of the building.
- * Adding additional commons/multipurpose space near the southeast edge of the gym.
- * Enhancing the current gymnasium and repurposing the current stage area in the gym.
- * Upgrading / renovating outdoor playground spaces and adding fencing to the southeast side of the playground.
- * Redesigning the east parking lot and pedestrian paths.

Elementary School Main Entrance:

- * Because the east main entrance will be closed during the entirety of the 2023-2024 school year, the main entrance for students and parents will be the southeast doors at the preschool entrance.
- * We will send more specific information about this as we get closer to the start of the school year.

Elementary Traffic Flow and Parking:

- * Patience will be the name of the game as we begin school at the elementary building. Due to the timing of the recent rains, the schedule for completion of the east parking lot was delayed a bit longer than initially anticipated. The parking lot is scheduled to be poured the week of July 17th and the lot needs to fully "cure" before we can safely drive vehicles on it, and this may be a week or so after school begins.
- * Because of the uncertainty involving the east parking lot, more specific information will be sent out to all parents detailing the traffic patterns and parking for the beginning of school sometime the first week of August. Please note: Parking at the elementary will be very limited until the east lot is finished.
- * Cathy Fick will be contacting all parents with students who ride our buses at the end of July to discuss specific pick up and drop off times.

Please let us know if you have any additional questions or concerns.

Elementary Open House:

- Currently, the elementary school Open House is scheduled for Thursday, August 10th from 5:00 p.m. 6:30 p.m.
- Please note: Given the current state of the east parking lot, this event may be rescheduled to another time to alleviate parking issues associated with the south lot being closed off and not quite being ready for vehicle traffic.
- Please stay tuned for more specific information regarding the first day of school traffic as we get closer to that day.

Bennet Elementary Playground Renovation:

- Another of the areas currently under renovation at the elementary school is the playground. This area is currently under renovation because we are trying to address potential water issues that may have impacted our gymnasium floor at the site.
- Currently, our main playground equipment is being moved, and it is scheduled to be reassembled further to the east side of the current playground.
- The current soccer/ football area is being regraded to level out the activity space, and the football soccer area will be moved to be more parallel to the concrete basketball court.
- Flexibility will also be paramount in terms of playground space as we continue to work towards making this area safer and more efficient for our students.

Senior High School Technology Changes:

- As we continue to evolve and learn how to best integrate the ever changing technology that continues to be present in our schools, we are making some changes with technology at the high school that will impact student cell phone usage and access at school.
- In response to challenges related to information security, artificial intelligence, privacy concerns, student engagement, and the impact of social media on students, we will be looking at changing our procedures regarding student cell phone access and usage at school this year.
- While we understand and appreciate that technology can be an integral part of everyday life (especially with our students), and we want to effectively integrate technology whenever possible, we also have to be cognizant of our students (and our own needs) to achieve balance with technology.
- More specific information will be communicated to parents and students regarding these changes as we get closer to the beginning of the school year.

Student and Staff Kudos:

- Even though our teachers and students have not been in school since the end of May, there still has been a lot of activity in and out of the district facilities this summer. Aside from sports camps, community events, summer school, field trips, high school weightlifting and conditioning, staff curriculum, technology and classroom management training, lesson planning, room preparation, and committee work; our staff and students continue to stay busy working to be ready when school starts up again in the fall. Keep up the good work!
- Additionally, I would also like to spotlight the hard work of our office support staff, administrators, custodians, technology support staff, food service, and maintenance/

- transportation personnel. The "behind the scenes" work these individuals do throughout the summer is critical in facilitating efficient and effective operations throughout the school year.
- Special congratulations also goes out to our students for their continued participation in our camps, clinics, and "team based" activities this summer and to our coaches and sponsors for organizing these activities. Events like basketball, football, volleyball, cheerleading, and other camps (as well as students attending leadership and extracurricular specific events like FFA and FCCLA conferences) are shining examples of our students and staff giving extra effort to enhance their skills throughout the year.
- Our students and coaches have also participated in summer weightlifting and sport specific conditioning activities, and they have also been involved in community events like the Old Settlers Picnic in Palmyra and the 4th of July celebration and parade in Bennet.
- Our students also continue to participate in a variety of community activities throughout the summer months, and many of them are also busy helping families at home or working at various jobs throughout the area. We are proud of all of their accomplishments and service.
- Finally, strong community support for our district and advocating for high quality public schools is critical for success. District OR-1 is an excellent school system filled with great students and outstanding staff members, but we simply could not do what we do as a district without the continued support of our community patrons and local businesses. There are a myriad of patrons and businesses who contribute their time and talents to helping our students, staff, and programs thrive, and we are grateful to all of them. Thank you for supporting our students, staff, and the district!
- In summary, we are very fortunate to serve in a growing and progressive school district with a solid commitment to continued excellence and a "kids first" approach to education. District OR-1 is a great place to be!

School Lunch Program and Student Meals Reminder:

If your family qualifies for free or reduced meal pricing, please ensure that you have all paperwork completed and turned in on time.

Please call our school offices if you have any more questions regarding school meals for next year. Please remember to fill out your forms for school meals (breakfast and lunch).

We have worked with our food service staff to keep costs as low as possible for our school lunch and breakfast programs. This year, there will not be any increase to lunch or breakfast prices at either building. A second entree will increase from \$1.25 to \$1.75 per item. This option is not available in the elementary school building.

A flyer explaining how to sign up and complete paperwork for our free and reduced lunch program is included in the newsletter.

Families should contact our school office as soon as possible for information on free and reduced school meal guidelines, income parameters, and application procedures.



ACTIVITIES NEWS:

"Preseason Sports Information: If you don't see your fall sport/ activity information in this newsletter, your coach will be reaching out to you at a later date with information."

HS practices can officially begin on Monday, August 7th.

All players need to have a physical completed prior to the start of practice. If you are unable to get one by the first day of practice, you may attend, but only watch.

Concussion Testing at Palmyra High School

This will be located in the downstairs computer lab (Mr. Conn's Room). Please enter through the south glass doors. If you can't make it due to other conflicts there will be opportunities for testing when school begins. Please only attend your scheduled time slot due to limited seating. Each testing session is about 40 mins in length. Testing is good for 2 years so please read the instructions for each testing date carefully.

August 1st 8am—**HS Girls (9-12th)** participating in Volleyball, Basketball, Wrestling or Cheerleading **only if you didn't test last year.**

August 1st 9am—**HS Boys (9-12th)** participating in Football, Basketball or Wrestling **only if you didn't test last year.**

August 2nd 8am—**JH Girls (7-8th)** participating in Volleyball, Basketball or Wrestling--**All 7th grade girl participants will test and only 8th grader girls that didn't test last year.**

August 2nd 9am—**JH Boys** (7-8th) participating in Football, Basketball, or Wrestling—**All** 7th **grade boy participants will test and only** 8th **grader boys that didn't test last year.**

Sports Physicals

If you are in grades 7-12th and plan to participate in a sport for the upcoming 23-24 school year, you must have a current physical on file, dated after May 1, 2023, at (or submitted into) the office prior to the first practice. An NSAA permission form is also needed on file prior to the first contest. Both the physical form and NSAA form can be found and printed from the school website under the HS Athletics tab.

2023-24 Activity Passes/Fees

For those wanting to purchase single or family passes, which are good for all athletic events at the school (exceptions; One Act, Main Stage, District and Conference contests), may do so at the Booster Bash scheduled for August 17th. Otherwise, passes may be purchased in the east downstairs office during normal school hours. Pass fees are as follows:

Senior Citizen Pass (60+): \$5

Single Pass: \$65

Family Pass: \$140

Regular daily event admission

JH Contest: Adults \$5, Students (K-12) \$3 HS Contest: Adults \$6, Students (K-12) \$4

Student Activity Fee (7-12th): \$40

Prom Fee: (New this year)—Starting in 7th grade and through their junior year, each student will pay a \$15 fee that will go towards their senior prom. This will eliminate the need for class fundraising and ensure that funds are available for the cost of the facility rental, deco-

rations, DJ and snack food. Additional leftover money from the prom fees will go towards the costs of cap and gown. Graduating classes of 2025, 2026 and 2027 will need to continue fundraising when they are juniors to make up the difference that was not collected from the beginning of their 7th grade year. Graduating classes of 2028 and beyond should have enough money from fees to cover prom expenses.

Activities Calendar

The Activities Calendar for the 2023-24 school year is linkable to Google Calendar starting July 8th by using the school website and clicking on the calendar icon on the main page. At the top of the calendar you can click the "Subscribe" tab to add it to your personal calendar. Another option is to download the "rSchool" app from your app store. Do a search for "Activity Scheduler" and follow the set up options for viewing our school's calendar. A final option is to use the www.eastcentralnebraskaconf.org link to view the school's events and activities through the summer and next school year.

2023-24 Booster Bash

This will be held at the Olson Complex on Thursday August 17th. Food and various booths selling apparel, activity passes and other activity information will be set up and ready by 5pm. The program portion will begin at 7pm.

Facilities use requests for 2023-24

Facility use requests for youth teams will be accepted starting Monday August 14th. Requests for volleyball and youth football will be processed first and then basketball and wrestling. Elementary gym requests can be made by emailing walter.lin@districtor1.net. High School gym requests can be made by emailing hoeft.aar@districtor1.net. Gym requests will be processed in the order received based on the email time stamp. Please indicate a first and second choice in your email with your preferred day and time. Due to the large number of requests in the past, teams are limited to one practice slot a week at either the elementary or high school. Due to construction, we have not established a starting date for these practices for either building, and some dates/times may be limited. Once we receive the requests we will coordinate with the construction contractors and communicate a starting date.

WELCOME BACK!

The 2023-2024 School Year will kick off on **Monday, August 14th** for students in grades K– 12th grade. This will be a full day of school.

BENNET ELEMENTARY:

Elementary School hours will continue to be from 8:20 a.m.-3:20 p.m. On the first day, all students in K-5 may report to their classrooms beginning at 8:00 a.m. Parents will not be able to walk their child into the school or classroom.

Preschool parents and students will report to the preschool on Tuesday, August 15th for their first day. Morning session will begin at 8:00 a.m. and the afternoon session will begin at 12:00 p.m.

If your child has not registered, please call the school office at 402-782-3535.

BUSING INFORMATION:

Bus routes are in the process of being created. Parents of students who are on country bus routes will be receiving a call from their bus drivers during the first week of August. They will give you approximate pick-up and drop off times for your children. If you are new to the district and desire bus transportation or have bus questions, please contact Cathy Fick at 402-540-2879.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS AND IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIRED:

Nebraska State law requires that all students entering kindergarten, grade seven, and new students from out-of-state show evidence of having received a physical examination by a qualified physician within six months prior to enrollment. Evidence of this examination must be presented within 30 days of beginning enrollment unless the parent/guardian declares in writing his/her objection to the physical examination. The cost of the examination shall be borne by the parent. All students in grades 7-12 who are out for any kind of sport must show evidence of a physical examination before they may participate in the sport. Physical examination forms are available at the office or online at www.districtor1.org. Search for "Activity Physical and NSAA Participation Forms". Or, click here if you are online.

IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

2023-24 is included in this mailing.

Students must show proof of immunization upon enrollment in District OR-1 Public Schools. Any student who does not comply with the immunization requirements will not be permitted to continue in school. Students with medical conditions or sincerely held religious beliefs which do not allow immunizations may complete a waiver statement, which is available in school health offices.

Students with a signed waiver statement may be excluded from school in the event of a disease outbreak.

ALLERGIES:

Due to various student allergies, **ALL** treats brought into the elementary classrooms need to be store-bought and individually wrapped with the ingredients clearly labeled. Thank you for your cooperation with this safety/wellness procedure.

The Breakfast Schedule

The Breakfast program will start on Tuesday, August 15th. No breakfast will be served on the first day of school.

Breakfast will start at 7:30 a.m. at Palmyra High School and 7:45 a.m. at Bennet for those students who ride the morning bus routes to school. Please note that District OR-1 school buildings open at 7:30 a.m. for HS students and 7:50 a.m. for Elementary Students not in the Rec. Program. Please do not arrive prior to that time.

The Lunch Schedule

Students will be told what time they go to lunch on the first day of school. Both the Bennet Elementary and Palmyra Jr/Sr High School campuses are closed: students may not leave for lunch.

STUDENT RECORD POLICY

District OR-1 Public Schools is required by Federal law to notify parents of students, and eligible students (a student who has attained eighteen years of age), that the school does maintain personally identifiable data on students enrolled in District OR-1 Public Schools. Parents of students and eligible students have the right to inspect and review the educational records of their child or children and to challenge the contents of the records as inaccurate or misleading.

Parents of a child or an eligible student who is or has been in attendance at District OR-1 Public Schools who desires to inspect and review their child's education records should contact either the custodian of records at the school or the office of the superintendent.

Notice is hereby given to parents of students and eligible students that the personally-identifiable information designated by District OR-1 Public Schools as directory information is as follows: the student's name, grade, address, email address, telephone number, date and place of birth, dates of attendance, the image or likeness of students in pictures, video or other film or medium, height, weight, most recent school attended, position in the group, experience in the group, candidacy for graduation, and/or the list of academic and/or activities achievement including, without limitations, honor rolls, scholarships earned, activity honors, and awards earned in connection with current school activities or class work which may be published onto the internet.

Parents of the student, and or eligible student, have the right not to permit the foregoing designation of any, or all, of the categories of personally-identifiable information, with respect to that student, as directory information, by informing District OR-1 Public Schools in writing, within four weeks after the commencement of the school year. If you have questions about the records policy of the school, please contact the office of the Superintendent at 402-780-5327.

PARENT NOTIFICATION OF TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

School districts that receive Title I funding are required to inform parents they have a right to know the professional qualifications of their children's teacher(s). Therefore, parents in the District OR-1 School District may request to know the qualifications of their child's teacher(s). As a parent, if you would like to receive specific teaching credential information about your child's teacher(s), please contact the office of the Superintendent at 402-780-5327. Please give the office at least five school days to contact you with information about the credentials referenced.

DISCLOSURE OF STUDENT RECRUITING INFORMATION

Federal Law requires schools to provide military recruiters and institutions of higher education access to secondary school students' names, addresses, and telephone listings. Parents and secondary students have the right to request that District OR-1 not provide this information to military recruiters or institutions of higher education without their prior written parental consent.

FEDERAL HANDICAPPED CHILDREN'S ACT

District OR-1 requests your help in locating handicapped children.
