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# Standard Response Protocol

Bennet Elementary's adoption of the Standard Response Protocol (SRP) provides a standardized approach to managing various events, both threatening and non-threatening, that may happen in or around our school.

These protocols provide actions for the following situations:

- Lockout (danger is outside the school)
- Lockdown (danger is inside the school)
- Evacuate (leave the school building, such as a fire)
- Shelter (tornado or severe weather)
- Hold (stay in classrooms due to a non-threatening event outside the classroom)

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# <u>Announcements</u>

### Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

A few reminders that I would like to share to help everyone get in and out quickly:

- Please have students enter and exit your vehicle on the passenger side of your vehicle. The drop off lane is extremely effective and the safety of your student is our priority. By doing this, we can ensure that students are not in zones of traffic and are not in harm's way.
- If you are using the parent drop/pick up lanes, please stay in your vehicles. If you
  would like to park and walk up, please utilize the parking spaces in the interior of
  the parent pickup/dropoff lane.
- In the afternoon only, Kindergarten parents may utilize the bus drop off lane for pickup for Kindergarten students and older siblings. Grades 1-5 will continue to use the primary pickup/dropoff lane. Teachers have now been assigned zones to help aid in the location of your students to help you get in and out quickly.
- For preschool students, we have begun a student drop-off zone similar to the primary drop-off lane. If you would like to stay in your vehicle, a staff member will assist with getting your student out of the vehicle.

Students that are participating in the Rec program can be dropped off starting at 7:00. All other students can arrive no earlier than 7:50 unless they are utilizing school bussing or the Rec Program. School starts at 8:20 and the tardy bell rings at 8:30. Breakfast begins at 7:50 and ends at 8:20.

#### **EFFECTIVE AND EXPIRATION DATES**

Coverage becomes effective the later of: the Master Policy Effective Date; r 12:01A.M. following the date the envelope containing the enrollment form and premium payment is postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service; or for online enrollment 12:01A.M. following the date the proper premium is received by the Plan Administrator. Interscholastic sports coverage expires on the last day of the authorized season of the current school year. School-Time and Full-Time coverage expires on the selected expiration date of the annual term policy.

#### **HOW TO FILE A CLAIM**

- Notify the school and obtain a claim form immediately. The school will fill out Part A of the claim form if it's a school injury.
- Parents complete Part B of the claim form. Answer all questions.
- Submit copies of the student's itemized bills to the student's family medical and dental coverage first, even if there is a large deductible. The other insurance plan will send a report called an Explanation of Benefits (EOB). This plan is supplemental to all other valid coverage. The claim must be filed with the other coverage first! (Coverage is excess in KS, primary in MT and NC after deductible, and in ID, IL) This Plan DOES NOT cover penalties imposed for failure to use providers preferred or designated by the primary coverage. (In KS, penalty does not apply) Send the completed claim form, copies of student's itemized bills and EOB to:
